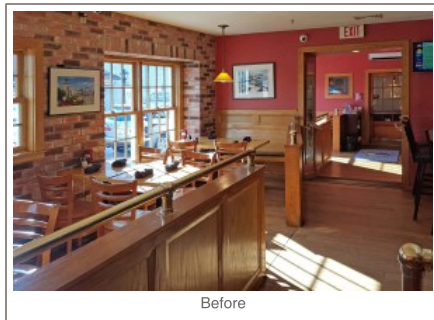
## Views from the Job site
